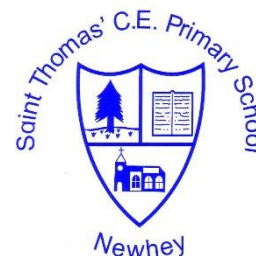

Parking Near School



I have had to speak to several upset and angry parents and local residents this week because of the large amount of dangerous and selfish parking near school. Following the visit from the police last Thursday, it is still continuing, with some parents blatantly ignoring the advice of the police for their own selfish reasons.

The situation is becoming increasingly frustrating and frustration is turning to anger. Many are scared for the safety of their children and quite rightly so.

All I request is that consideration is taken when parking your car.

- Do not park on or drive up Church Street between 8.15am and 9.00am and between 3.00pm and 3.30pm.
- Do not park on the double yellow lines or on the zig-zags. The double yellow are there because it is a junction. It is impossible to see the road clearly if it is blocked by cars!
- Stop using Church Street as a turning circle – it is not a turning circle!
- Stop parking on the pavements
- Don't complain when you get a parking ticket – it is your fault!
- Stop parking on both sides of Huddersfield Road on the single yellow lines which indicate parking restrictions
- Park on Railway Street, Haugh Lane, Two Bridges Road, the car parks near the Cedar Tree or Milnrow Park

All of the above is common sense and within the law. We teach our children to respect rules and the law – adults should too. What message are you sending to your child if you continue to break the law and do your own thing?

You are sending the message that I can do what I want irrespective of other people and the law.
